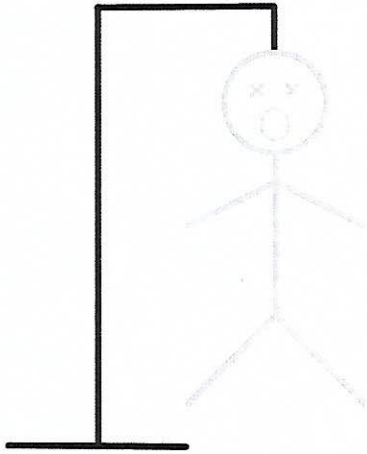

Spelling Hopscotch

The hopscotch board consists of 10 numbered squares arranged in a standard hopscotch pattern:

- 1: A single square at the bottom.
- 2 and 3: Two adjacent squares above square 1.
- 4: A single square above the space between squares 2 and 3.
- 5 and 6: Two adjacent squares above square 4.
- 7: A single square above the space between squares 5 and 6.
- 8 and 9: Two adjacent squares above square 7.
- 10: A square at the top, enclosed in a semi-circular arch, above the space between squares 8 and 9.

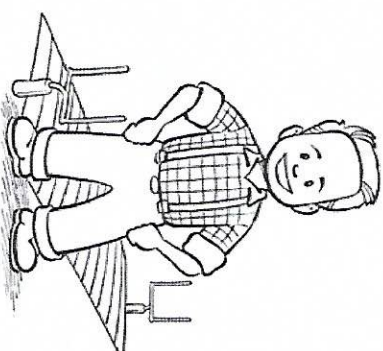

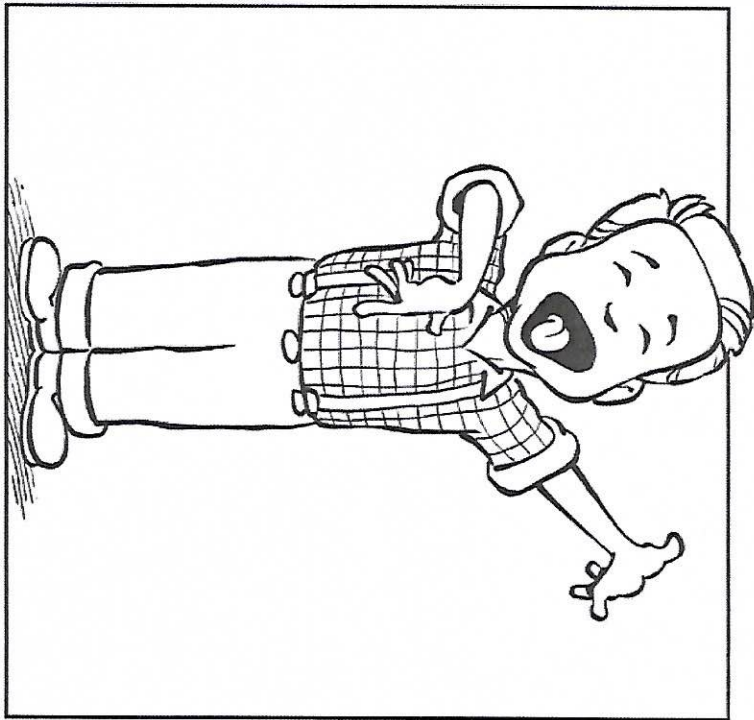

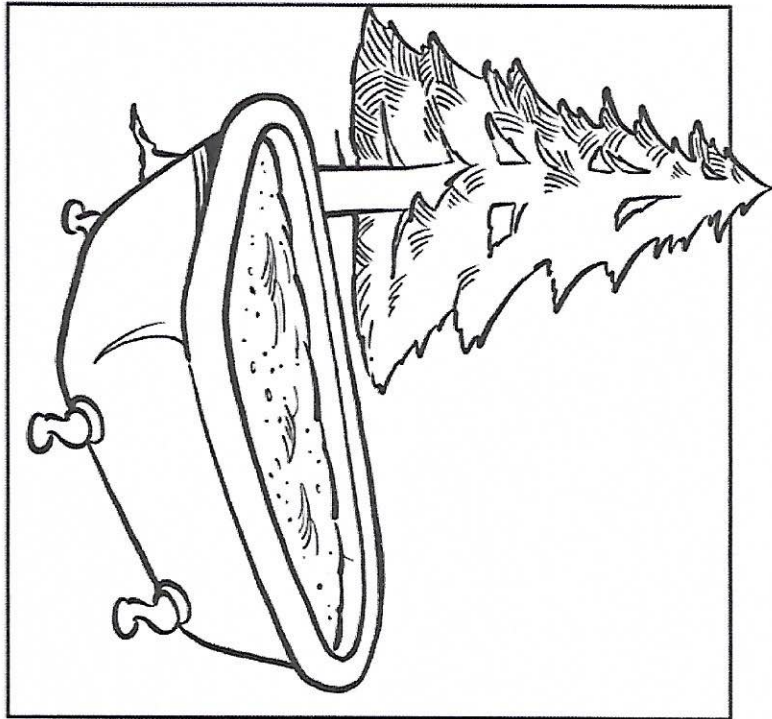
